2021/2022 LICENSING

Cat and Dog Licensing

City Ordinance 91.02 requires all cats and dogs within city limits be registered once a year. Registration costs are \$5 per animal that has been spayed/neutered and \$30 per animal that has not been surgically altered. Proof of current vaccinations and proof of spay/neuter must be presented to obtain a license. The number of domestic animals allowed per household is **2 cats and 2 dogs**. The penalty for unregistered animals is \$180 per animal, assessed to the property taxes.

Golf Cart/ATV/UTV Permits

Golf carts, all terrain vehicles, and utility task vehicles must also be registered with the City once a year. The cost per vehicle is \$15 and proof of current insurance must be presented to obtain a current permit. The penalty for unregistered carts and vehicles is \$50 for the first offense and \$100 for each following offense, assessed to the property taxes.

License and Permit applications are due by Wednesday June 16th.
