## GRASS HEIGHT ORDINANCE

Summer is upon us! With that comes yard maintenance. This is a friendly reminder of Hartland's City Ordinance #50 that does not allow any growth of weeds, grass, or other rank vegetation to a height greater than six inches, or an accumulation of dead weeds, grass, or brush. When mowing, please avoid mowing, raking, and dumping grass clippings or leaves onto the street.

## CURFEW

Reminder, curfew for minors is at 9:30pm and will be enforced. Repeated violations can lead to fines of up to \$100.

"Ordinance 11 Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 17 years to loiter, loaf or idle on or about any public street, avenue, alley, park or other public place in the [City] of Hartland between the hours of 9:30 pm and 5:00 am of the following day..."
