Mayor Kelly Routh called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm.

Motion to approve the agenda, minutes from the council meeting on March 7<sup>th</sup>, and the accounts payable was made by Megian, seconded by Molly; motion carried.

**Public Input:**

- The City will contact Dave Wallin about landscaping the park sign area.
- A member of the Resiliency Committee shared information about the new Freeborn County Memory Café, a place for people with memory loss and their caregivers to go and enjoy each other's company. This event is held twice a month and the City will advertise for it in upcoming newsletters.

**City Maintenance:**

- The new water plant building has siding damage because it was installed incorrectly. The original contractor that installed the siding and the inspection company will be contacted, as everything from the plywood outward needs to be replaced. This is not a result of the tornado but instead improper installation.
- The power pole at the lift station broke and has been replaced by Xcel Energy. No electronic controls can be attached to the new pole as they need their own control panel. Randal Electric will be doing the control panel work and will install a new generator switch. Work should be covered by state disaster relief.
- The gazebo is estimated to cost \$19k to replace with a similar style, this does not include labor. Any upgrades to materials will need to be covered by the City.

**City Clerk:**

- In March the City received \$4,130.02 from the Fire Department Lawful Gambling account profits, Megian made a motion to designate this money to the park fund, seconded by Molly; motion carried.
- The City would like to sponsor a spring clean up day. A dumpster will be placed in a public location for residents to dispose of clean up materials. The duration of the dumpster will likely be for one weekend. Advertising for this event will be done once all details are finalized.

Council:
