2020/2021 LICENSING

Cat and Dog Licenses

The City Ordinance 91.02 requires that all cats and dogs within city limits be registered once a year. Registration costs are \$5 per animal that has been spayed/neutered and \$30 per animal that has not been spayed/neutered. Proof of current vaccinations and proof of spay/neuter must be presented to obtain a pet license. The number of domestic animals allowed per household is **2 cats and 2 dogs**.

City Ordinance prohibits dogs and cats from running at large.

Dogs should be accompanied by a responsible person and effectively restrained by a leash. City ordinance requires all pet owners to clean up after their pets on their property and when walking around town.

Golf Cart/ATV/UTV Permits

Golf carts, all terrain vehicles, and utility task vehicles must also be registered with the City of Hartland once a year. The cost per vehicle is \$15 and proof of current insurance must be presented to obtain a current permit.

Due to the office being closed to the public because of the Stay at Home order, licenses and permits may be obtained by mail. **Please mail or put your payment in the black drop box along with a copy of proof of vaccination/proof of spay or neuter/proof of insurance for golf carts, and a phone number to contact with any questions.** Permits and pet tags will be mailed once all of the requirements have been met.

License and permit applications are due by June 15th. If the Stay at Home order is lifted before then, please feel free to stop in the office during office hours to complete license and permit requirements.

SPRING CITY WIDE GARAGE SALES

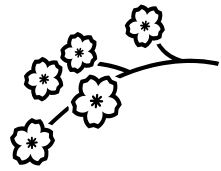

2019 CONSUMER CONFIDENCE REPORT

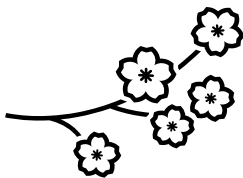
The results of the Consumer Confidence Report (drinking water quality test) will not be mailed to residents or published, but is available upon request. Please call the City office if you would like to receive a copy.
